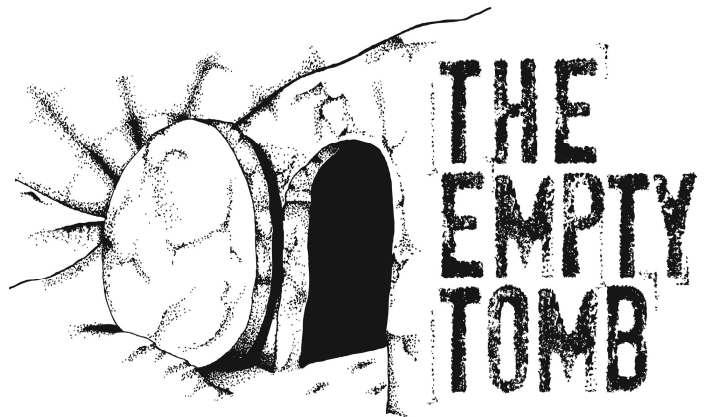
Message from Pastor Tim

My dearly beloved family of Cross Lutheran Church,

“Picture this if you will...” Whenever someone says this to me I get nervous. Someone is about to describe something and inevitably their vision is completely different than what I was envisioning. Men, how many times are you “sent” to the store to get a can of beans only to find that there are thousands of varieties of beans? What to do? Take your cell phone, snap a picture, send it to the power to be, and confirm that is the correct variety of beans to buy.

A picture is worth a thousand words. The subject of the picture is worth a thousand words. What then is a picture of the empty tomb worth?

NRS John 20²⁴ But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came.²⁵ So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said



to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

Thomas did not believe it when his fellow disciples said, “Picture this if you will...” Thomas needed proof of the risen Lord. Thomas needed a “picture” of the risen Lord and once he had that “picture,” that was enough for him to say “My Lord and my God.”

Wouldn’t it be great if we could have that “picture” that Thomas had and be able to say “My Lord and my God?”

Wouldn’t that strength our faith in Jesus to actually touch his hands, touch his robe, and hear him speak, pray with him and laugh with him. Wouldn’t it be great to take as ‘selfie’ with Jesus? WOW!! Obviously that can’t be done. Obviously there is not a “picture” of Jesus anywhere. There are “pictures” of what people think Jesus looks like but none are authentic. Just images of what he might look like.

How then are we to have the same experience that Thomas had if we cannot actually see and touch the real Jesus?

believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

Even though we have not seen the physical Jesus, our belief and faith gives us a high definition picture of what Jesus looks like.

And we see him every day. People say I have never seen Jesus or any miracle of him. Then I say you have never seen a sunrise or a sunset. You have never seen the miracle of birth. You have never seen a young child say please and thank you. You have never

seen someone get sick and then be healed. You have never seen the trees and plants come alive in spring. You have never seen the array of colors in the fall. You have never experienced someone just lending an "ear" to a friend to vent their terrible day. You have never read scripture and experienced the peace and comfort that comes from the word of God. You have never experienced praying with someone in times of need. I could go on and on and on. All of those are "pictures" of Jesus Christ.

If we truly believe that

Jesus is raised from the dead, then we truly need to be the "picture" of the glory of the resurrection to everyone we meet. "Picture if you will... comfort, peace and joy through the "picture" of baptism, the cross, and the empty tomb. That is a picture worth a million words and is priceless. Let that picture be you in the name of Jesus Christ to others.

March 21

The minutes of the February 28 meeting were reviewed and approved. The Treasurer reported \$2,833.88 in the checking account. The Treasurer's report was approved. There was no correspondence.

BUSINESS: Hearts for the Homeless - It was noted that Kevin Sturm donated the 100 take-out boxes that were used to package cookies for Hearts for the Homeless. Thank you, Kevin! Mom 2 Mom Sale – So far 10 tables have been reserved for the sale on April 29 from 9 am to noon. Aileen sent out a press release today. We need to put up more flyers in local businesses. It was decided to have the baked goods sale in the gym.

Ministry Reports

We may have a popcorn machine and sell popcorn too. Garage Sale – June 8-10. Set-up is Thursday, June 1 at 6:30 pm; collection dates are Saturday, June 3 from 10 am-2 pm, Sunday, June 4 from 9 am to 3 pm, Monday, June 5 from 9 am to 8 pm and Tuesday, June 6 from 9 am to 6 pm; pricing takes place on Wednesday, June 7. The sale on Thursday and Friday, June 8 & 9 is from 9 am to 6 pm, and on Saturday from 9 am to noon. Krisie volunteered to do the paperwork to apply for Thrivent funds. VBS – The dates for VBS are July 17-20. Lori reported that plans are going well and two people have volunteered to provide wood slices for a craft project. Recording Church Service – After learning that the church has a license to record church services, we decided to ask Randy Ovcen for advice about recording equipment, since he has knowledge and experience in this field. Randy gave a short presentation to the group about audiovisual equipment and the possibilities it could create. He will continue to do research for us on this project and keep us updated. After Randy left, the group discussed how this could benefit our church from the elderly to the youth. New technology would give us the capability for high quality audio to record the church service as well as provide the capability to integrate some contemporary type music/visuals to the church service, VBS, Christmas programs, etc., which is something the youth and younger generation enjoy. After a lengthy discussion the group decided to designate a portion of the garage sale money to begin a fund for new audiovisual equipment, pending Council approval. Lorraine will present

this at the next church council meeting.

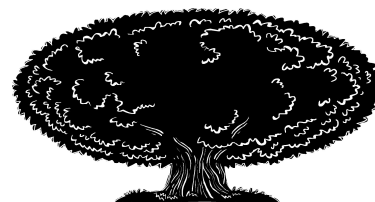

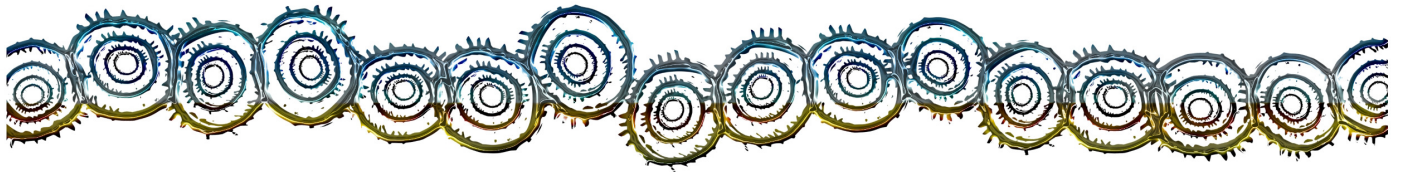
