Lent is the season when we prepare ourselves for Easter. It is a time of year when we especially consider our sinfulness and our need for a Savior. We begin with Ash Wednesday, March 6 this year. As ashes are placed on our foreheads, we hear the words "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Annual Meeting Minutes

February 10, 2019

CALL TO ORDER: The 2019 Annual Meeting of Cross Lutheran Church was called to order by President Kent McKenzie following the Sunday Worship Service at 10:45 a.m. The meeting was held in the sanctuary of the church. Interim Pastor Mike Tamorria offered the opening prayer. Attendance was taken and a quorum was present.

AGENDA: President Kent McKenzie announced that the purpose of the meeting was to vote on the proposed changes to the constitution and Bylaws that had previously been distributed and to give an update to the congregation on the work of the Call Committee to date. Rachel Higgins read the proposal aloud before the congregation for a final review. A motion was made by Norm Nelson to accept the changes as printed and read to go before the congregation for a vote. The motion was seconded by Pat Azarovitz. Motion carried.

VOTE: A paper ballot was distributed and collected for tally.

RESULT OF VOTE:

1. Restructuring the church council to make it smaller, and so that committee chairs will no longer (necessarily) be members

of council: YES – 73, NO – 10

2. Simplifying and shortening the process for amending the constitution: YES - 80, NO - 3

Changing the date for the annual meeting, so that it will consistently be held in February rather than November. A separate congregational meeting will be held in December each year for the proposed budget: YES – 83, NO – 0

CALL COMMITTEE: Gretchen Roestel informed the congregation that several interviews have taken place with applying candidates. At this time there is one more applicant scheduled for a phone interview on February 12, 2019. The committee continues a prayerful search.

CLOSING PRAYER: Pastor Mike Tamorria offered a closing prayer.

ADJOURNMENT: With no further items to address John Trowbridge made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Denny Smith seconded the motion. Motion carried and the meeting ended at 11:20 a.m.

Vacation Bible School will be held July 17-20, 2019, with "Super Jesus" as the theme.


We will host the coffee hour on March 24, with Group 2 (Bonnie, Kay, Connie, Rachel and Nancy) serving.

#### From Church Council: Daycare and Young 5's Proposals

At the February council meeting, council members heard presentations about starting a daycare and adding a young 5s program to the school. Council is in favor of starting both of these programs for the 2019/2020 school year, and voted unanimously to hold a special congregational meeting after church on Sunday, March 3, for the members of the church to listen to, discuss, and vote on the two proposals.

The idea for starting a daycare was first brought to Council in November by several young mothers in the congregation. A committee was formed to look into what it would take to start a daycare here at Cross. After meeting with a licensing professional from the state, it was learned that the current license that is held for our preschool can easily be expanded to include daycare children. This makes things much simpler than trying to get a brand new program licensed.

The proposed plan is to create a year-round daycare program for infants, toddlers, and preschoolers. According to this plan, the daycare could have a capacity of 33 children. Two classrooms in the school would be used as daycare rooms. The room currently being used for preschool would be converted into a daycare room for infants and toddlers. One of the other classrooms would be converted into a preschool room, which would be used for 3-4-year-old daycare and preschool class. Currently, one of those rooms is being used for music, band, and a staff workroom. Music and band could be held in other classrooms or in the church.

Once up and running, the daycare would be self-sufficient and would not require any money from the church. Any initial start-up costs provided by the church will be repaid, and any extra money taken in by the daycare will be donated to the church.

The addition of a Young 5s class is a separate proposal from the daycare. Young 5s would be open to students who are not quite old enough or ready for Kindergarten. The proposed idea is to create one multi-age classroom for Kindergarten and Young 5s students. This would change the current K-2 classroom into just 1st-2nd grade, and would eliminate the need for the current K-2 aide (para-pro) position. The cost for the salary of the new Kindergarten/Young 5s teaching position would be completely paid for through FTE money from Lakers and tuition, and it will not create extra expense for the church. There will be a minimum number of students required for this proposal to go into effect.

At this time, the idea is to use the cafeteria as the Young 5s/Kindergarten classroom. Students would eat lunch in the gymnasium. The classroom would be able to be packed up when extra space is needed for events such as the Fish Fry, Garage Sale, robotics competition, etc. Other spaces that could be considered for use as a classroom include the Library and Family Room.

Both of these programs offer opportunities for Cross Lutheran Church and School to grow and expand in our mission to instill the Word of God into the hearts and lives of children and families in this community. "Train up a child in the way in the way he should go: and when he is old he will not depart from it." Proverbs 22:6

roasters to serve, serve, keep everything filled, clean up after messes, wash dishes, help prepare takeout orders, serve drinks to people, clean up tables, smile, show hospitality, welcome people and give guests a tour of our church and school, take out trash, oh my! lots of gifts are needed!

Then there is the clean up! take everything off wash tables. tables down with bleach water. take down tables and chairs, while in the kitchen there are dishes to do, food to put away, desserts to figure out where they will go, floors to sweep, signs to pick up, more dishes to do and put away etc, etc, etc. You get the point.
