# **Message from Pastor Tim**

To my family of Cross Lutheran Church,

Congratulations goes to the family of Cross Lutheran for a spectacular 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration! Well done to all in planning, resourcing, coordinating and implementing all that made the 125<sup>th</sup> a spectacular day. Well done good and faithful servant.

Now that the 125<sup>th</sup> is over; now that the novelty of all that took place has subsided; now that school is back in session and we all are back in the "normal" routine of life; we settle back into our comfort zones of what each of us would say is our "normal" life. Routine in life is good for it brings a sense of secureness and familiarity that we count on to get through the daily routine of school, work, and extra activities.

However, by settling into routines, we start to settle into ruts to where we feel this is normal when in actuality things need to change for survivability of the future. We Lutherans do not like to change. It is not in our DNA. There is an old, old joke about that; how many Lutherans does it take to change a burnt out light bulb? Answer; CHANGE!?

This family of Cross needs to change. We are too comfortable in how we are. We are living by the motto "if it isn't broken, don't fix it." Well part of this family is broken and needs fixing right now.

There are approximately 52 youth i.e. toddler to senior in high school, who belong to the family of Cross. The average attendance in Sunday school is 6. There are many youth in which this family of Cross is entrusted to raise them up in the church so they can bring their children up in God's house i.e. Cross Lutheran.

Within the baptismal ceremony, the parents of the child are responsible for the following in raising their child within the church "You should, therefore, faithfully bring (him / her) to the services of God's house, and teach (him / her) the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments. As (he / she) grows in years, you should place in (his / her) hands the Holy Scriptures and provide for (his / her)

instruction in the Christian faith, that, living in the covenant of (his / her) Baptism and in communion with the Church, (he / she) may lead a godly life until the day of Jesus Christ." (LBW pg 121)

If the church charges families to bring them to church so they can learn the stories of the Bible, the Ten Commandments and the Apostles Creed, then the church i.e. Cross Lutheran must have programs in place to ensure the teaching for the children. In order to have programs in place to fulfill the above said obligations there must be volunteers to make these programs happen. Every family member of Cross agrees that youth are the future of this church and need to be involved within the church. Everyone agrees that if the church does not provide this teaching, the children will learn from what our culture is teaching today which has nothing to do with Jesus Christ. What more motivation is needed to start good Christian programs for our children? Yet the fact remains, Cross has no programs for the youth because no one wants to volunteer. This

drives a knife in my back and literally kills me when I think about this.

The nominating committee is starting to meet and will be asking for volunteers to help start and organize a "youth program" for the children of Cross. This will not be the traditional way of doing things for we live in a different culture than 60 years ago and that model is outdated and doesn't work in today's culture.

I am deeply concerned with the culture our youth are being raised in. I'm more concerned with parents of Cross Lutheran who do not see the need to bring their children to church knowing what the culture is teaching youth.

My family of Cross, if you are concerned about the youth as I am, let us come together and start thinking and doing something for the sake and benefit of our children and their children's children. I will work with you to get this off the ground. It is time to stop being comfortable and stand up and change. The NALC has a great youth initiative called Faith Webbing enabling youth to learn faith skills through building relationships with each other and adults. It works and can work here. I will help. I need someone who has a compassion to bring our children to Jesus Christ to help me start this.
