Message from Pastor Tim

My dear family of Cross Lutheran Church,

The temperature is almost 60 degrees, the birds are chirping, there is a definite sense of nature transforming its self into spring and the "boys of summer" aka baseball players, are throwing that little white ball around. It must be April or May. However, to my disbelief I look at the calendar and at the top it says February and there are still 6 more days till March 1. What in God's green earth is going on!? You have to admit this winter has been very mild compared to winter's past.

Mission/Outreach Ministry Minutes

January 24

The minutes from the Nov. 29, meeting were reviewed. A motion was made by Rachel Messing to approve the minutes, and seconded by Lori Smith. Motion carried. Lori Smith, Treasurer, reported \$3,432.56 in the checking account. A motion was made by Rachel Messing and seconded by Bonnie Schulz to approve the Treasurer's report. Motion carried. Several thank-you cards were read, as well as an invitation to the Food Pantry Annual Meeting.

Old Business: Operation Christmas Child: Lorraine reported that Thumb National Bank and employees donated \$620, and \$1,960.98 was collected from Cross' benevolence offerings in December to be sent to Samaritan's Purse to help cover the postage costs for the 2016 shoebox gifts. Lori reported that four boxes were tracked and email notification was received that they were delivered to children in St. Lucia and Zambia. We have been informed that OCC shoebox gifts can no longer contain candy or toothpaste, so we will no longer ac-

cept these items. Also, we will no longer accept regular shoeboxes, as we will only be using the OCC preprinted shoeboxes.

New Business: The Mom 2 Mom Sale, with the addition of a bake sale this year, will be held on Saturday, April 29 from 9:00 am to noon. Lorraine will get a poster for the sale in the newsletter. Lori will organize the sale with Rachel's help. Rachel will put the poster on Facebook. Set-up will be on Friday, April 28 from 6:00 to 7:30 pm and Saturday morning from 7:30 to 9:00 am. Entrance fee will be \$2.00 for adults. The date for the annual church Garage Sale was set for June 8, 9 and 10, 2017. After discussion, it was decided to do a Valentine cookie sale called Hearts for the Homeless. We will take orders for cookies through February 6 at a price of \$7.00 per half dozen and \$10.00 per dozen. Rachel will handle the orders and M/O members will bake and frost the cookies. Cookies may be picked up at the church on Saturday, February 11 from noon to 2:00 pm or Sunday, February 12 after church. All the proceeds will be given to the Huron County Homeless Solutions. Lorraine will try to arrange for a speaker that Sunday. Once again we discussed the subject of recording the church service for our shut-ins. Pastor will talk to Beth Elston about what license we need to be able to do this. Gwen will ask her husband, Randy Ovcen to check into recording systems and what would be involved in making the re-

cordings. Jean Sturm has offered to make Easter cards for our shut-ins. Mission Outreach signed up to host the following coffee hours: February 12, March 19, May 21, October 8 and November 12.
