Message from Pastor Tim

My Dear Family of Cross Lutheran Church,

"When all else fails, read the instructions." Many Christmases ago, when our children were kids, we brought our daughter a Barbie Doll House unassembled. The plan. send the kids to bed Christmas Eve and then put the doll house together. Great plan, no problem. On the outside of the box it said, easy assembly, you need only a screw drive, done in 30 minutes. So at midnight I start in. One hour goes by and the frustration level is high and a voice says 'read the instructions.' A 'real man' does not need instructions to put a doll house together! Another hour goes by and the voice once again says 'read the instructions.' I'm tired, frustrated, and have come to the conclusion that I'm not a 'real man.' I capitulate, read the instructions and 30 minutes later the doll house is assembled. The following morning our daughter is excited about the doll house and plays with it for 5 minutes then for the rest of the day she plays with the box the doll house came in. UHG!! Why didn't I

read the instructions in the first place?!

Isn't that what life is like? We have been given instructions as to how we should lead a godly life, i.e. the Yet, how often Bible. do we really read the Bible? Who needs instructions on how to live? We all know how life should go and how to handle adversity on our own. Who needs instruction on that? WE DO!!

If we are constantly in the Bible, constantly feeding ourselves with the word of God, constantly feeding ourselves Jesus Christ, life would not be as difficult as it is when we don't read the instructions.

The other part about reading the Bible is that we need to read the Bible to our children. They need to see that parents / adults read the Bible daily so that they will imitate what we as parents do. They imitate everything else we do both good and bad so let us show them that it is essential to read the Bible daily.

Our children

need to hear the story of Christmas every year but not the version that Hollywood puts out but the true version that provides instruction for life, the Bible.

NRS **John 1:1** In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was in the beginning with God. 3 All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being 4 in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. 5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

Now I hear all of you saying, I have a Bible so what's the big deal? I'm glad you do. But I wonder how many of those Bibles are on the shelf and have a layer of dust on them. How many were given as a gift brand new decades ago and are still in brand new condition. A boat is not built to sit at the dock and look pretty. It is built to sail the oceans of the world. An airplane is not built to sit on the tarmac and look pretty. It is built

FROM THE DESK OF... RETH ELSTON

Recently I had the opportunity to attend an early childhood conference in Howell. It was a massive conference with 1500 early childhood professionals in attendance! Of special interest to me was the keynote speaker, Jim Gill. Besides being a multiple award-winning children's musician, Jim has a Master's degree in child development, and has worked for more than 20 years with children and families, including children with special needs. He exuded enthusiasm and joy, and had all 1500 participants singing and dancing to his educational songs.

Interspersed between songs were the "why" and "how" of the deeper educational value of his music activities. Of course he spoke of word segmenting sounds, phonemic awareness, rhyme, meter, and a variety of other educational jargon, but the most striking pronouncement he made that day was a quote from research: The single, most important indicator of infant/toddler future school success is playful, loving interactions with adults. That's the bottom line, the foundation, and the basis for the rest of a child's life.

Note the absence of any educational jargon. the absence of teaching strategies, curriculum, benchmarks or standardized testing. It's an ideal and truth worth repeating: the single, most important indicator of infant/toddler future school success is PLAY-FUL, LOVING INTERAC-TIONS with adults.

When does the importance of playful, loving interactions diminish? Does it diminish when a child enters kindergarten, fourth grade, high school? I would argue never. It is continually and profoundly important throughout our lives. Such interactions in our close relationships and between generations help us to become the best human beings that we can be, through every stage of our lives.

How? Could it be that playful, loving human interactions are a reflection of God's very heart? Do you know that God rejoices over you and celebrates over you? In His joy, He even sings over you! Consider Zephaniah 3:17. "The Lord your God is with you, the Mighty Warrior who saves. He will take great delight in you; in his love he will no longer rebuke you, but will rejoice over you with singing."

God's heart for us is indescribable love and joy. May we all bask in His delight.
