## **Message from Pastor Tim**

My dearly beloved family of Cross Lutheran Church.

As I write this I'm looking out the window and I see tall banks of snow starting to melt away. Old man winter is starting to loosen his polar artic grip and oh my does it feel good. I long to see green grass again, flowers blooming, and the first freshly cut grass aroma to permeate the air. I can smell it now as I sit here.

It is also a time where we start to get busy in anticipation for all that is needed to be done to get ready for spring. Our minds are going a hundred miles an hour with outside projects, getting the camping gear ready, trailers out of hibernation. motorcycles tuned up, bikes greased up, boats waxed, reservations for the traditional summer vacation, ordering mulch and dirt for the yard and garden, ordering all the necessary items to open the pool, and don't forget the most important of all, camp fire wood needs to be cut, split, and stacked for another seasons s'mores!! Busy, busy, busy.

Yet, in all of that busyness, we enter into the season of Lent. A time of forty days where contemplation, discernment, and solitude with Jesus Christ and God is first and foremost. Matthew 14: 22 Immediately he made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. 23 And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone.

A time where we need to look inward as to who we really are and what we are in relation to Jesus Christ. A time to try and comprehend what God did for us through His son on the cross so that we might have eternal life and peace.

NRS **John 3:** 14 And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, 15 that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. 16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not

perish but may have eternal life. 17 "Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

A time to take a deep breath and just sit in the quiet peaceful presence of Jesus Christ. "Well, I do that every day pastor. I go to my 'special' place in the house and have my five minutes of devotional time and then move on into my day. Also, when on vacation I sit by the lake and just meditate. It is so relaxing and peaceful." All of that is well and good but that is not 'sitting quietly in the presence of Jesus Christ.'

To sit and experience the peace of Jesus Christ is a peace that is not centered on "our" peace but the peace that he gives to us as a gift from the cross. That is a peace of wiping away our sins, our stress, our guilt, our shame, our fears, and our bondage to sin. That is a peace we try and give ourselves by sitting by the (Cont. on Pg. 2)
