# **Message from Pastor Tim**

My dear family of Cross Lutheran,

I have deep concern for the youth of our family of Cross Lutheran Church. I consider youth to be babies through seniors in high school.

Each child is a gift from God. God has given us this gift to feed, nurture, and teach the grace, love, mercy, and forgiveness of His son Jesus Christ our Lord. Each child has received the Holy Spirit through baptism. *NRS* **Romans 8:** <sup>14</sup> For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. We, the family of Cross Lutheran, have been commanded by God to raise these children to fear, love, and follow God's son, Jesus Christ and to lead a godly life.

<sup>NRS</sup> **Deuteronomy 6:** <sup>4</sup> Hear, O Israel: The LORD is our God, the LORD alone. <sup>5</sup> You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your soul, and with all your might. <sup>6</sup> Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. <sup>7</sup> <u>Recite them to your children</u> and talk about them when you are at home



and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. <sup>8</sup> Bind them as a sign on your hand, fix them as an emblem on your forehead, <sup>9</sup> and write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

My fear and concern is that the family of Cross Lutheran is not doing the best we can for our children as commanded by God.

Within our materialistic and me-myselfand-I culture, the family unit is increasingly allowing the "social morals and values" to be the foundation and guiding light that our children are instilled with to make life decisions. In other words, parents, knowing God, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit, would rather feed their children the

culture of today because it's easy, popular, and "doesn't hurt anybody."

<sup>NRS</sup> **1 Timothy 4:** <sup>11</sup> These are the things you must insist on and teach. <sup>12</sup> Let no one despise your **youth**, but set the believers an example in speech and conduct, in love, in faith, in purity.

Cross Lutheran has always had a "youth program" and cares for their children. Currently, however, there is reluctance for adult leadership. I wonder what signal that sends to our youth.

NRS Matthew 7: <sup>9</sup> Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for bread, will give a stone?
 <sup>10</sup> Or if the child asks for a fish, will give a snake?

Are we willing to take the easy way out and feed our youth stones and give them snakes rather than go against the popular culture and feed our children the bread of life?

<sup>NRS</sup> **John 6:** <sup>33</sup> For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." <sup>34</sup> They said



# FROM THE DESK OF ... DEB MUSOLFF

The teachers of Cross Lutheran School recently had the opportunity to attend the Michigan Association of Non-public Schools General Conference and Expo in Grand Rapids. This year MANS celebrated 40 years of service to faith-based schools. Education issues in Michigan have always impacted Non-public schools. We learned that in 1970 "Proposal C" was passed by voters in Michigan despite hard work to defeat it. Proposal C became Article VIII, Section 2 of the Michigan Constitution which prohibited aid to Non-public

Schools. The consequence is that Michigan has one of the most restrictive Constitutions regarding Nonpublic schools in the United States. This had a huge impact causing many school closures.

Learning this information was a "wake-up" call for me as a Christian and as a citizen of Michigan. I need to be more fervent in prayer for our government and its leaders. As I get ready to vote in November I need to be informed and know how issues affect my state. Am I considering just myself or am I voting for the common good? I hope you will do the same.

Learning is a lifelong adventure!
