Listening for the Promise

Weekly Devotional

Ash Wednesday - March 5, 2025

"Yet even now," declares the Lord, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments.

Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster.



- Joel 2:12-13 -

As kids, my younger sister and I would often get into disagreements. There is a three-and-a-half-year age gap between my sister and me. So, it meant we could be heard bickering over some of the silliest arguments. When our voices got to a certain volume level, my mom or dad would intervene. It was escalating quickly, and it would most likely turn into a physical brawl rather quickly if measures weren't taken. So, Mom or Dad would break us up. Then they listened to both my sister and me grumble and complain as we tried to explain our side of the situation. After listening to both sides, our mom or dad would settle the dispute. "Theresa, tell your sister you're sorry." I'd mumble "Sorry" while glaring at my sister. My sister would return the same apology with the same muttering and glaring. Mom or Dad would then tell us to go, play, and get along with one another. We'd stomp out of the room, no more reconciled than when we'd begun the argument.

My sister and I were not displaying true repentance or reconciliation. As an adult, I understand that reconciliation can't happen without truly feeling sorry and genuine repentance. In Bible days, people expressed sorrow by tearing (rending) their clothes. Everyone who saw them knew they were grieving. If someone wanted to demonstrate their repentance and sorrow over their sin, they would publicly tear their clothes. However, the outward display didn't always mean they were sincerely repentant in their heart. Much like when I muttered "I'm sorry" to my sister, it wasn't sincere. When we sin against God and others, God's Word insists outward sorrow isn't enough. We must mean it on the inside.

So, what is the appropriate response to sin? The spiritually proper response to sin is a rending of our hearts— seeing our sin as God sees it—and humbling ourselves in confession and repentance. "Return to the Lord your God," Joel 2:13 reads, "for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger

and abounding in steadfast love." Confession and repentance don't restore our salvation, because Christ's death on the cross settled that forever. Instead, they restore the relationship we enjoyed with God before sin interrupted our fellowship.

So, the next time we sin against God, may we pause to reflect on why we did it and how it affected God. Then, take a moment to pray, confessing your sin to God and asking for his forgiveness. Rend your heart, not your garment, because when you do, God's steadfast love and patience will surround you in forgiveness and restoration.





Opening Prayer / Devotional – President John Smith: Meeting opened at 7:02PM with a reading from 2nd Timothy and a prayer.

Approval of Agenda – Motion to approve the agenda made by John House, 2nd Norm Nelson, Motion passed.

Approval of Council Meeting minutes from January with corrections of Christmas Eve service changes (instead of New Years Eve) - Motion to approve amended minutes made by Al Licht, 2nd John House, Motion passed.

President Report - \$485 donations for NALC Disaster Relief collected after church services; shutin visitations ongoing.

Principal Report: David Faupel

- Profit from CEA Winter Dinner Auction estimated to be \$47,000
- One of the robotics teams qualified for the State Championship.
- Custodial Assistant (Deb Lange) has been selected. Motion to hire Deb at \$15.00 / hour with an estimated 15 hours per week, made by Nancy Schuette, 2nd by Dick Koehler. Motion passed.

Early Childhood Center - No report received

School Board – Dick Koehler No meeting this month. Motion to appoint Rebecca Yackle as School Board Secretary for a 1-year term made by Dick Koehler, 2nd by Al Licht. Motion passed.

Secretary – no known communications.

Treasurer – Kim Sears – Phil Schadd gave the monthly report. Income was \$5,287 over budget for the month. **Motion to approve the treasurer's report was made by Al Licht, 2nd by Nancy Schuette. Motion passed.** Discussion on adding two people as authorized signers for the parsonage loan. Will table this item until next month.

Properties – Al Licht – Council will request additional members for the properties committee. Al Licht would be willing to be the first contact for any repair requests on an interim basis.

Music – John House Will implement communion on the 1st & 3rd Sundays on a permanent basis, starting in Lent.

Stewardship - Norm Nelson Written year-to-date offering report provided.

- Health insurance for the principal David Faupel proposed a health care plan that would lower the cost to the church by using Samaritan's Ministries. The monthly fee paid to Samaritan's Ministries would be \$665.00 for family coverage. Motion made by John Smith, 2nd by Dick Koehler to rescind the January vote on the health insurance and accept the Samaritan's Ministries plan with the church to pay for David's out-of-pocket cost up to a total annual cost (monthly fee + out-of-pocket costs) of \$15,000. Motion passed.

New Business -

 positions will be issued.
- Discussed requests from area churches to use Cross facilities to host Lenten Services, Easter breakfasts and community funerals. Council agreed that due to church staffing and logistical issues with the school that this is not feasible at this time.
