

From the Pastor's desk at Cross Lutheran Church-NALC,

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, grace, and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

"You have made known to me the paths of life; you will make me full of gladness with your presence.'!" (Acts 2:28)



Each month, writing a message for the Cross Lutheran Church newsletter has been at times a personal challenge, and yet has always pleasantly surprised me by unveiling another opportunity to grow. Without fail, my preparation always seeks God's Word for guidance. Without fail, a single Bible verse provides all I need when I am at a loss for words. God's Word is good! It always shines abundantly with grace, forgiveness, and love!

One of my favorite movies is the 1960 Walt Disney movie, "Pollyanna." The main character, Pollyanna Whittier, is an 11-year-old orphan who is sent to live with her wealthy Aunt Polly Harrington in the town of...Harrington. Even though Pollyanna is busy overcoming many recent changes in her life, she continues to be her cheerful, talkative, very optimistic self, focusing on the good things in life and always finding something to be glad about. She

describes this personal game as "The Glad Game," because she feels that it is important to look for the good in life instead of the bad. Pollyanna explains, "You see, when you're hunting for the glad things, you sort of forget the other kind." With this positive outlook, she begins to make a wide variety of friends in the community of Harrington.

It is no secret due to her wealth and influence that Aunt Polly controls most of the town, which includes the church and the subject matter of Reverend Ford's Sunday sermons. When the town wants to hold a charity bazaar to raise funds for a new orphanage, Aunt Polly is not in favor of it. The Harrington family had donated the original building and she argued that it was an important town landmark. Since she has a lot of influence, many of the townsfolk are reluctant to show their excitement and support for the charity bazaar for fear of her retaliation.

When Reverend Ford refuses to support the charity bazaar for fear of Aunt Polly, Pollyanna reminds him that "nobody can own a church." Pollyanna also tells him of the over 800 'Glad Passages' in the Bible. The next Sunday, instead of preaching 'gloom and doom' as Aunt Polly has always recommended, Reverend Ford decides to defy Aunt Polly, and promises the congregation to read one 'Glad Passage' from the Bible each Sunday from this time forward. He also announces that he supports the charity bazaar and encourages all church members to attend.

Although there is much more to the plot, my favorite scene in the movie is when the townsfolk gather at the Harrington mansion in the last minutes of the movie. Pollyanna and her Aunt Polly are preparing for a necessary train trip and all present wish Pollyanna to get well soon and hurry back home. As Pollyanna and Reverend Ford meet, he says to her, "We looked for the good in them and we found it, didn't we?" and Pollyanna smiles and shakes her head in agreement.


"Let no one seek his own good, but the good of his neighbor." (I Corinthians 10:24)

If it has been a while or if you have never watched the movie, Pollyanna, I encourage you to check it out sometime soon. The movie reminds me of the innocent times we experience growing up. As children, we look for good role models such as our parents, relatives, friends, and community to provide examples of healthy relationships for us to emulate. Churches offer Christian education in the forms of Sunday School, Confirmation, and Vacation Bible School for our youth, but have we applied what we once had learned in our youth now as adults? Do we act as if 'Jesus Christ owns the church' or do we assume ownership? More importantly, the church has always had the responsibility to teach and to provide examples of healthy relationships for our young people. The question we must ask ourselves as active members of Cross Lutheran Church is, "How are we doing? Have we taken time to examine ourselves? Have we provided examples of good relationships for our young people, our newest members, and our first-time visitors? As active members of Cross Lutheran Church, have we spent more time hunting for the glad things, instead of focusing on the other kind?"

"Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." (Colossians 3:12-17)

# **New Security Procedures**

- Upon arrival, press the doorbell by the office entrance doors. You may be asked to give your name and reason for visit. The door will then be unlocked for you to enter.
- Upon entering the building, visitors will need to sign in at the office. They will need to sign out when they leave.
