I remember traveling to a town in Northern Wisconsin to watch my son play high school baseball one spring. I expected it to be a nice warm sunny day, since the sun was out. I was taking my camera, hoping to get a few good pictures since my son was going to be pitching. As I was about to leave, LuAnne suggested that I pack some warm clothes in case the weather became colder, which turned out to be a pretty good idea!

At the beginning of the 2nd inning of the baseball game, the dark clouds rolled in and it quickly got cold. As I

walked to the car to put on something warmer, it started to snow and the flakes got bigger! As we arrived, a huge ship was turning, ready to come in from the big lake. It wasn't more than five minutes later when we watched it travel through the canal, under the lift bridge. It was amazing!

Since the sun was starting to set, we started for the car. As we walked, my son turned to me and said, "Can you believe it? Going from playing baseball in a snowstorm to seeing a ship come in as soon as we arrive? What a great day!" I wholeheartedly agreed and we talked about it most of the way home. It had been a great day! It was only about a month later when our two youngest sons graduated from high school. That was seventeen years ago!

How did that happen? Where did the time go? We've all said something similar from time to time as we look on days that have passed...and time continues to pass day by day. Let us thank and praise God for each blessed day that He has given us and continues to give us. As brothers and sisters in Christ, God continues to bless our Church and community, one day at a time.


"It is recommended that all decorations be placed alongside the gravestone or very near so as not to impede mowing."

CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES: April 16, 2020

The meeting was called to Order by Church Council President, Michael LePage, at 7:05 p.m. Present were: Nancy Heck, Gretchen Roestel, Krisie Fritz, Pastor Glenn S. Sokolowski, Nancy Schuette, Norman Nelson, Kent McKenzie, Steve Schulze, and Corey Messing. Guests Present were David Faupel and Sarah Brooks. The meeting was conducted through Zoom and by Phone. Pastor Glenn Sokolowski opened the meeting with a devotion from John 16:29-33, and was followed with prayer.

AGENDA: Agenda was approved as presented.

MINUTES: March minutes were approved as presented.

OFFICER REPORTS:

Mike LePage, President – Updated council as to the financial aspect of the church at this time. Cross has applied for the Payroll Protection Program.

Pastor and Mike LePage have been noting the volume of envelopes that are being dropped off so they can be deposited timely.

Cross received a bill from Braun Builders in the amount of \$6,700.00 for changes that were made after the work was started on the Sound Booth. It was recommended by Mike LePage that the bill be paid and the money taken from the CD bequest. Discussion followed.

Motion was made by Kent McKenzie that the bill be paid to Braun Builders in the amount of \$6,700.00 and taken out of the CD bequest, seconded by Gretchen Roestel. Motion carried.

Krisie Fritz, Secretary - No communications

Nancy Heck, Treasurer - Nancy gave her report as presented.

Motion was made by Krisie Fritz to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented, seconded by Kent McKenzie. Motion carried.

GUEST PRESENTATIONS/REQUESTS:

David Faupel gave his School Report as follows:

- School has been closed by the Governor for the remaining school year.
- Teachers are working hard to provide instruction to the children.
- Teachers are providing daily openings by live stream.

Sarah Brooks gave her Early Childhood Center Report as follows:

- Day Care currently has 11 children (6 families). At this time the day care can only provide care for essential workers.
- Sarah would still like to hold a Preschool picnic, but will wait until it is safe for all.
- Sarah would like to meet with the Advisory Group as soon as it permits.
- Sarah will be working on State Renewal which is due in the middle of May.
- One family is staying with the Day Care when everything goes back to normal.
- Local Health Department is keeping checks on the Day Care during this time.

ADVISOR'S REPORTS:

Pastor's Report: (1) hospital visit, (2) family funeral meetings, attended Pastor Orth's funeral service, (2) funerals (Fred Edler and Elsie Trowbridge), attended Cross Fish Fry, (1) Wed. Lenten Service, teaching Confirmation classes, over 200 phone calls to parishioners and continued conversations, (6) Online services, and multiple home visits to deliver audio CDs of recorded worship services.

School Board Report: Gretchen Roestel - No meeting held.

<u> MINISTRIES REPORTS – TRUSTEES:</u>

Property: Corey Messing – updated council regarding items he has been working on:

- Building and Road Signage Plates have arrived as well as the light for the corner of the property.
- Kent McKenzie will contact Booms regarding estimate so that the work can be started in the classrooms.
- Corey reached out to Doug Gentner. Huron County Work Crew is unavailable to assist with any projects at this time, but can assist when the quarantine is over.
- Corey will work with Sarah Brooks regarding a time that will work to fix her light that is out in the Day Care Room.

Worship & Music: Kent McKenzie – no meeting held.

Stewardship: Norman Nelson – no meeting held.

Mission Outreach: Nancy Schuette - no meeting held. Krisie Fritz did address council on two matters. First, was a request to postpone the Garage Sale for June, but leave it open as to when it would be rescheduled. Council was in favor, Mission Outreach will put a flyer out on Facebook that can be shared and put in the Church Newsletter. Second, was requesting that Cross Lutheran pay a portion of the Easter Card costs that went out to all members. Discussion followed.

Kent McKenzie made a Motion to pay the entire bill for the Easter cards and postage out of the fish fry proceeds in the amount of \$382.05, seconded by Gretchen Roestel. Motion carried.
