#### Listening for the Promise

Thanksgiving Day (USA) – November 23, 2023

"And you shall eat and be full, and you shall bless the Lord your God for the good land he has given you." -Deuteronomy 8:10-



Dependence. As a mom of three, I have enjoyed watching my kids grow and develop their own independence. However, when they entered into the world, they were completely dependent upon their dad and me. Someone had to make sure they were wearing proper clothes, keeping their body temperature regulated. Someone had to cuddle them when they needed to feel secure. Someone had to make sure they were nourished with proper food so they could grow and thrive. If someone hadn't been there to provide for them, they would never have survived.

In our reading from Deuteronomy, the Israelites have been through a lot. They had fled Pharaoh and his army, crossed the Red Sea, and entered into the wilderness. They would find themselves wandering through the wilderness for forty years before arriving to the Promised Land. Throughout that time in the wilderness, however, God did not forget about his people. He did not neglect them. The Israelites were in a barren land, which meant that water and food were not readily available to them. But God creates something out of nothing, and that's just what he did for the Israelites!

God provided water from a rock. He gave them manna and quail to eat. God saw to it that his people would not perish. God placed a hunger in his people - a hunger for him, depending solely on him for their survival.

It's easy for us to forget how much we need God. When we have things (food, water, shelter, family, unnecessary material goods) readily available to us, we can begin to take all those things for granted until they're not available to us. Sometimes God allows us to experience a lack of something in order to humble us. It teaches us once again that we need to depend on God for everything we need in this life. And as we depend upon God for everything, he indeed provides for his children.

May we be reminded of all of God's good gifts he provides for us, most especially the gift of salvation we have been given through his son Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord.
