
Message from Pastor Tim

My dearly beloved family of Cross Lutheran,

aware that this is not going to last, we once again look for new life among the living.

NRS John 12: 23 Jesus answered them. "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴ Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies. it bears much fruit.

The only place to be renewed in life is within Jesus Christ. In so doing we must "die" to our sins. From the Desk of ... Beth Elston

During March, we asked preschool students to tell us what they like about school. One of the student answers that I found especially mean-

ingful is "I like the teachers reading the books." This reflection says a number of things. Obviously the student adults value children and want likes story time, but I think there is more going on than the exposition of information, believe in their ability to sentence structure, ideas, problem-solving, cause-andeffect, logic, patterns, sequencing, rhyme, word play and the pathos involved in human relationships.

In contrast to the active play that students thrive on, story time is a more teacherdirected activity, in which the students are *receiving* more than they are *doing*. What are they receiving that holds them spellbound and motionless for the duration

of the book? They are receiving the message that reading is powerful; that to engage in a quality experience with them; that adults learn to read, and in the children's own dreams for the future.

What can you do to foster a love of reading? Read to a child. Read to a group of children. Write or tell your own story for children. Give the gift of a book to a child. Give a book or donate money to a children's library, school or daycare. Give locally or across the world. Do any of these things, and children will be blessed.
