Call Committee Summer Report - July 2024

With the busy summer months here, some are probably wondering what is going on with the call committee. We want to assure you that we are active and in frequent contact with each other and with the council. We have a small, but wellfunctioning group who continue to be very responsive and receptive, even during vacation time. Below we have provided a review of the duties and responsibility of the committee to the congregation as a refresher. Some of you will remember well after serving on this committee in the past, others may have attended the workshop and others may just wonder what is happening. Hopefully this will simply answer a few questions.

During the call process there is a protocol directed by the NALC and implemented by the call committee. First the committee must show due diligence to the entire congregation by inviting and encouraging members to attend a workshop where everyone's input is considered and listed, concerning the talents and abilities we hope for in a Pastor. (Our workshop was held this past February.) That list is then narrowed down to the top 5. This list, among many other topics related to our church, its members, practices, outreach, missions, and history are then used to create our church profile. This document, along with a video showcasing our church, school, parsonage, and community is then posted on a website for all NALC Pastors in the US and Canada to view.

A Pastor may decide or "ponder" a change is needed either with his personal and or pastoral life. This is called the discernment period. This is described as a spiritual process for the Pastor, that is led by the Holy Spirit. The goal is to allow God's will to unfold in such a way the call committee, council and congregation recognize and receive the Pastor whom God is calling. It is a process about the revealing of God's will, not the "hiring of a Pastor' as quickly as possible.

The role of the Call Committee does not stop after the posting of the profile document and video. As a committee, we are first responsible to keep the congregation informed as well as provide support, encouragement, prayer and devotion in relationship to our call for a Pastor. We also work together to develop questions and plans on how to effectively identify the Pastor who best fits our "wish list" as developed at the workshop. This is a tall order, so the committee is put to task to try to see the individual that best matches, through video and in person discussion and interviews. We are also privileged to a Pastor's profile which provides some very personal and confidential information about them. Pastors often want this time to be kept totally confidential, since they may not have even discussed possible change with extended family, let alone their current congregation. Hence the reason the call committee respects these wishes and releases very little information.

We also are expected to have a Chaplin on our committee, who is Carol. She leads us in prayer and devotion at our meetings, as well as during the committee updates on Sundays. This is to keep us grounded and on task, reminding us to pray and be patient, and that the Call committee is still active and present.

Pastor Shelly Schulz from the NALC is the call coordinator for all of this and works closely with call committees and discerning Pastors attempting to try to find the "best fit" between pastors and church vacancies. She is very responsive and keeps us up to date on all changes and updates.

With all of this said, don't be discouraged, but rather grateful for the dedicated people who continue to keep this church viable. The committee will update the congregation with any information that it can when it is ready to be made public, taking all previously mentioned in mind.

As a reminder, here are the top 5 things, developed from the workshop, on the list for wishes for a Pastors talents and abilities:

- 1. Flexible and collaborative by being physically present in the church and school, thus promoting unity between church, school and daycare, giving special emphasis on the youth of the church.
- 2. A passion to teach and preach about and love Jesus, in a humble, Christ like manner.
- 3. Friendly, personable, and relates to all age groups, especially the youth, our future
- 4. Builds spirituality both on a personal level as well as with the entire congregation
- 5. Community involvement by attending local/regional events that are commonly attended by local clergy.

To help everyone feel positive, here is part of an e-mail sent to the committee "from a looker" in relationship to our profile and video showing the positive impression that is reflective of our congregation.

"Wow! Wonderful video—also what a blessing to see such a magnificent congregation of the Lord's Children doing his work of taking care of creation and their neighbors. It also gave my heart joy to see your school at work and see the many youth being blessed and happy in their learning too. The music was so lovely too. Your Bell choir is great and the choir was splendid. The sanctuary is spectacular. Your parsonage is very nice too. Clearly, you folks value your Pastors a great deal to take care of their housing needs like that. Your church profile is very well done and reflects lots of thought and discernment on the part of you folks as well."

I found this very encouraging and happy that we are viewed this way. So, continue to be patient and prayerful. We waited for 2 years during the last call.

From the Desk of...David Faupel

I hope you all have been enjoying the summer! It's hard to believe that school will be starting in less than a month. The first day will be August 27, and we are planning a back-to-school family event on Wednesday, August 21. We are excited to welcome back all of the teaching staff from last year! We have a great team of talented people that have answered God's call to minister at Cross Lutheran School.

There has been a lot of activity going on both inside and outside of the school building to get ready for the new year. In case you haven't seen it, the new playground equipment has been installed, and it looks amazing! A big thank you to Lindsay Stachowiak and Jeremy Licht for heading up and organizing this project and the many volunteers who helped them make it happen. It took multiple years of careful planning and a lot of hard work. The students are going to love it!

There have also been some changes inside the building. Earlier this year, the Church Council voted to create an additional classroom for the school, allowing us to go from housing three grades in a classroom down to two in the upper grades. This will allow us to provide lower student-to-teacher ratios, improve the quality of education, and ultimately serve more students in the future. To make this happen, the Church has graciously allowed us to turn the Family Room into a 7th/8th grade classroom, which is where I will be teaching this year. I am still in the process of moving and setting up the new room.

Since band and piano classes formerly were held in that room, the Church has also been gracious in allowing us to use the Overflow from 9:00-11:30 each morning for that purpose. That space will be set up and taken down each week to accommodate. The space is free to be used other times. In cases of funerals, band classes will not be held and I will take the 7th and 8th grade students to a different location for the day to have class. If the church can use the new classroom for any other purposes outside of school hours (Sunday School, Bible studies, meetings etc.), I would love to see that happen. Please feel free to reach out to me with any questions or concerns that you may have about this.

Thank you for your continued flexibility and support for the school. I am excited to see the ministry that will take place here during the 2024-2025 school year, and I hope you are too.



Principal Report: David Faupel

School has ended for the 2023-2024 school year.

Currently, 65 students, are registered for the 2024-2025 school year. Possibly a few more.

Last year, there were 65 in attendance. One student has left school and 2 have moved from area. There is currently room for 1-2 more students for each classroom, for the 2024-2025 school year.

The new classroom is moving forward. Thanks to all who have helped clear out room.

All teachers are returning for the next school year. However, the Kindergarten teacher, would like to just do the kindergarten class, to focus more on that. She no long wishes to do the Music classes. Music class will be in need of a teacher, that would be shared with Laker school.

Cindy, our part-time kitchen help, will not be returning.

Another New Addition for the next school year, is Spanish Class, which will be offered to 7-8 grades. Spanish teacher will be shared with Laker School.

David will be teaching 7-8grades. During the Spanish class, David will be able to focus on his administration duties.

In years passed, our Pastor would teach religion. David Faupel has been filling that position.

It is proposed to council for the upcoming school year, that we bring Pastor Dave Wilson, from the First Baptist Church, to teach religion from the Bible, not theology, 2 days a week.

Currently, Pastor Wilson's wife, Kate is on the Cross school board, plus their children attend Cross school. He is not seeking any compensation but, the school would like to offer Free lunches for his family. Motion was to accept made by Josh Barry and 2nd by Kim Sears.

Early Childhood Center – Miki Thick

Custodial Update: David Faupel

Special contract committee-John Smith, David Faupel, Josh Barry, Kim Sears and Kevin S. had a few meetings regarding the need to update/propose-contract to offer to Marcine for the position of Head Supervisor for Kitchen and Custodial position. This will be 13 month contract to redone end of July 2025. Contract was presented for approval. See attached contract for details.

Current custodial contract was: \$22,000.00, Current kitchen salary: \$22,000.00, Proposed combine Full time, declined Health insurance, \$43,500. plus addition \$3,500. for declining insurance. Marcine is ready to start this position.

Motion to Approve contract proposal 1st, Dick K and 2nd by Al L.

A part-time custodial employee will still be needed for up to 15 hours a week at an estimation of \$15-16,000.00 for a year. This has not been set or negotiated yet.

There is also a need for a part-time kitchen help position available. Again, no information has been set on pay etc.

Teacher Recognition: An anonymous individual has expressed desire to make a donation in an undisclosed amount to be paid out to our teachers. This would include 5 full time teachers, 1 at 15 hrs per week and 3 at 7/8 hrs a week (these are shared teachers). It is decided by council to divide donation among the teachers based on hours worked. Final amount and donation to be set with donor and distribution hopefully by Mid June for 1st pay period of July.

Motion for approval by Dick K. And 2nd by Nancy S.

Also motion to add the teacher recognition to this agenda. Motion for approval by Norm N. 2nd by Dick K.

Mileage Request for Pastor Interview:

Call committee has informed John S of a Pastor Inquiry. There is a pastor that has showed an interest in our church and what we have to offer. Name will be withheld at this time. Pending further interest in said pastor. This will avoid any communication for misunderstanding as he currently has a congregation.

Pastor and his wife will be visiting the Tri-county area and will come visit our church and talk with the call committee. It is presented to council that we pay for his mileage from Tri-county to our church and also pay for dinner and expenses occurred to visit us. Motion to pay with cash 1st Dick K., 2nd Norm N.

Discussion: if and when a pastor is interviewed and negotiations start, Cross would then be required to take down our profile

Other Business

John S. presented a nice Thank you from Gwynne B. She expressed her gratitude for receiving a small pay for her teaching of confirmation classes.

David F., a New Fulltime teacher is needed. Now that we have an additional classroom. We have 1 part-time teacher interested in going full time. She currently is also part time aide (which makes her full time already). She is well qualified as she has a master degree.

If she becomes the Fulltime teacher, we will be losing a part time aide, however the aid will not need to be replaced due to having smaller class sizes. Special council and discussed a salary of \$35;000.00 plus insurance to keep in line with other teachers however no contract has been completed. David F. will provide money figures for July 9th council meeting for proposed salary vs current pay for part time teacher plus aide.

Our aides are currently being paid via COVID Grant monies. This money needs to be used up by Fall. However, there is a loophole to issue this money to Lakers School and they will pay out aids for what maybe the next couple years.

In addition, David F., also informed council that tuition will be increasing.

Full time teacher issues will be added to July council meeting agenda. Motion to accept: Dick K., seconded by John H.
