From the Pastor's desk at Cross Lutheran Church-NALC,



At one time or another, many of us have chosen paths that seemed to be the best decision at the time, but in taking a moment to look back, it now seems like we may have wasted a lot of time. Mind you, not every path may have been unfruitful, but there were a few that may have set us back a few years. As many of you may know, I first felt the call to ministry the evening of my Confirmation Day; Sunday, October 31, 1971. My mother was the only

one that I trusted with this information and as you can imagine, she was very pleased to hear that her son may one day become an ordained pastor. As a young teenager, I knew that I had a lot to learn before taking a serious step in that direction.

After time, the voice that I had once felt strong in my heart became weaker almost to a point that it would barely seem to whisper, but I knew it was still there and I never stopped hearing it. To make matters a little more uncomfortable, my mother would remind me of our discussion decades later. "Do you remember what you told me what you wanted to be?" I would answer, "Yes, mom…but that's not going to happen now." She would respond, "Just remember what you said." If there had ever been a time for a Lutheran to experience "Lutheran guilt" it would be through the voice of my mother with each gentle reminder.

As each year passes, I find myself reflecting on the past, "What if?" What would have happened if I had shared this ministerial calling with my pastor while I was still in high school? What if I had entered the seminary sooner? There may have been a straighter, simpler path than the seemingly long way around that I took.

I am most thankful, and yet amazed by the power of the Holy Spirit that my call to ministry many years ago was not left unanswered. Fifty years have now passed since I became a confirmed member of the Lutheran church through the Rite of Confirmation. As you can see, it was a very special day for me. Through the grace of God I am now a called and ordained minister of the church of Christ serving by His authority. I believe I am finally where the Lord has always wanted me to be.

On Reformation Sunday, October 31, 2021, Cross Lutheran Church will again celebrate a special day when a sister in Christ will be confirmed at Cross Lutheran Church. I wonder what the Lord has already planned for her in service to

the church in her future vocations. As a 7th and 8th grader, she was given the opportunity to attend Confirmation classes that helped prepare her to become a confirmed member of this congregation. These classes included subjects such as: The Old and New Testament, The Ten Commandments, The Apostles' Creed, The Lord's Prayer, and the Sacraments, concentrating on Martin Luther's Small Catechism.

In November, there will be an opportunity for adults to explore Luther's Small Catechism in an informal class setting. Do you feel called to gather with others who may have similar questions? The instruction will be very basic, focusing on the same information that we provide for our confirmands. It will also include basic instruction on the Bible.

As fellow brothers and sisters of Christ, let us encourage each other in our own personal and corporate journey in faith. No, I'm not asking you to become seminary students with the goal of becoming ordained ministers, but I am asking you to faithfully attend the October worship services in preparation of affirming your own Confirmation. May we have ears that are open to hear God's word and eyes to see the path that He still has planned for us. May we learn alongside our beloved confirmands so we can dialog with them and support them on their life's journey. May we grow stronger in our mission to share the Good News with our community as we have been called to serve in His name.

God has a plan for His people. Just as He was faithful to Sarah and Abraham, He is faithful to us as well.




Tuesday, August 24, 2021

David wanted to extend a big THANK YOU to Pat Azarovitz, Steve Schulze and Mike Sting for picking up the lunch tables and to Marcine Moore, Mike and Jean Sting for deep cleaning the kitchen prior to school reopening.

MINISTRIES REPORTS – TRUSTEES:

Property: Matt Zimmerman gave his report as follows:

Pat looked back on old minutes regarding the speakers, Jesse's bid expired with estimate of 1,500.00. Current estimate on speakers has increased to \$1,800.00.

Music & Worship: Pat Azarovitz gave his report as follows:

Beth still waiting on organ repair estimate.

Beth started rehearsals for special music.

Stewardship: Norman Nelson reported that benevolence was \$565.00.

Mission Outreach: Krisie Fritz - no meeting held.

Parish Life: Nancy Schuette – no meeting held. Nancy stated that she needs people to sign up for coffee hours.

Youth: Steve Schulze absent. (no report)

OLD BUSINESS:

A. Church and School Staffing – this matter was handled earlier under David Faupel's report.

B. WIFI in the Buildings – there has been issues with WIFI in the hallway leading to the school. David Faupel will contact Paul Gaeth to come and investigate the problem. Currently the school pays for the internet service.

NEW BUSINESS:

A. Marcine Moore Compensation Proposal – was given to all present and discussed.

Motion was made by Dick Koehler to pay Marcine Moore \$15.00 per hour for six hours per day for Kitchen Compensation and to increase Marcine Moore's Janitorial Compensation \$250.00 per month (monthly compensation would be increased from \$1,865.00 to \$2,115.00 per month) as proposed, seconded by Nancy Schuette. Motion carried.

Second Motion was made by Dick Koehler to compensate Marcine Moore for the additional help she has to hire each week of \$40.00 per shift for 52 weeks, for a total of \$2,080.00 per year as proposed, seconded by Pat Azarovitz. Motion carried.

Third Motion was made by Pat Azarovitz to compensate Marcine Moore \$20.00 per hour for the additional 40 hours spent cleaning the day care areas this summer, (\$800.00 to be reimbursed from Day Care), and to compensate Marcine Moore \$20.00 per hour for the 16 hours she spent prepping for new tile floor in classrooms and hallways, also taking apart shelving and moving all items in the kitchen storage areas for the floors to be replaced and waxing the entrance and preschool bathroom (\$320.00 will be paid by the school), seconded by Dick Koehler. Motion carried.

(Matt Zimmerman was excused from meeting at 8:55 p.m.)

B. Deposit Account Changes – need to remove Sarah Brooks from the Day Care Account and add Shannon McCain, Mike LePage and Nancy Heck. April Rujan needs to be removed from the CEA checking account and Michelle Walsh added to the account.

Motion was made by Pat Azarovitz to remove Sarah Brooks from the Day Care Account and add Shannon McCain, Mike LePage and Nancy Heck to the account, seconded by Nancy Schuette. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Pat Azarovitz to remove April Rujan from the CEA checking account and add Michelle Walsh to the account, seconded by Dick Koehler. Motion carried.

OTHER BUSINESS:

A. Drive thru Chicken BBQ - to be held possibly in September, 2021. Mike will check with Steve Schulze regarding this fundraiser.

Next Council Meeting – Next council meeting will be held on Monday, September 13, 2021 at 5:00 p.m.

Cross Lutheran Mission Outreach Ministry Will once again collect filled shoebox gifts and individual


filler items for shoeboxes. We will
