Message from Pastor Tim

My dear family of Cross,

Have you ever said or done something you wish you hadn't? And once you had said or done it, you realize the far reaching consequences, the guilt and shame take hold, self doubt, the wishing to turn the clock back and do the proverbial "do over" set in along with that sick feeling in your stomach. Why do we do such things? Why, when we have done it before don't we learn? Those of us who have many "life experiences" under our belt should know better, yet we seem to forget the pain of the aftermath and continue to say and do things we shouldn't. Why do we not learn from our mistakes? Young people coming right out of high school and college have some excuse because of lack of "life experiences." However, we who have years upon years of "life experiences" cannot use youthfulness as an excuse for such behavior. Why dowe do and say things that hurt people and break relationships? Sadly it is because we put our-

selves first rather that put-

ting God and others feelings before ourselves.

Just recently I found myself to be in that exact position; saying and doing something that I wish I hadn't. Being insensitive to others because my self centeredness got in the way of being pastoral, and doing that as a pastor is especially harmful and hurtful. I came to the realization that my self centeredness and insensitivity towards others was more of my sinful humanness over taking me where I should have been pastoral. So in my self examination as to where I went wrong, I go back to where God always wants me to go, scripture.

NRS Proverbs 11:12 Whoever belittles another lacks sense, but an intelligent person remains silent.

NRS Proverbs 13:3 Those who guard their mouths preserve their lives; those who open wide their lips come to ruin.

NRS Proverbs 17:28 Even fools who keep silent are considered wise; when they dose their lips, they are deemed intelligent.

NRS Proverbs 21:23 To watch over mouth and tongue is to keep out of trouble.

NRS Proverbs 29:20 Do you see someone who is hasty in speech? There is more hope for a fool than for anyone like that.

All of these scripture passages speak directly to me as to where I went wrong. I need to practice what scripture says and that is to try the best I can, in my humanness and bondage to sin, to follow and imitate what my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ did for me;

NRS Isaiah 53:7 He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slawghter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

As I learn and grow into my called vocation as a pastor, I am learning from my short comings which is developing me to be a more competent pastor for Cross. Additionally, I'm learning and experiencing what it truly means to be humble and ask for forgiveness. There by the grace of God I go.


