
Message from Pastor Tim

My dear family of B and plan C Cross Lutheran, is going to

WOW! This has some summer! The temperatures have been in the 80's and 90's almost everyday. rainfall is way below average for this time of year. It's been too hot to have camp fires at night. It's been too dry for flowers, gardens, and crops to grow like they normally should.
