Message from Pastor

My dear family of Cross,

The Lenten season is once again upon us. Lent is the traditional time in which each one of us takes a 40 day journey. It is a journey where we reflect upon our relationship with God, our relationship with others, and our relationship with our selves. It is a journey that starts on Ash Wednesday and finishes on that glorious Easter morning.

Lent is threefold, Ash Wednesday, the journey, and Easter. Question; which of these three is the longest? Ash Wednesday and Easter are well defined, have significant meaning, and mark the beginning and end of Lent. Shouldn't the journey also be well defined and have significant meaning? Shouldn't the journey provide moments where our relationship with God changes our lifestyles? Shouldn't the journey expose our sinfulness while at the same time provide our salvation in Jesus Christ? With all that and more, it seems that the journey is highly significant and well defined.

The journey of life is of the same nature. Birth and death, beginning and end are well defined and have significant meaning. The journey in between is not well defined but highly significant. Jesus Christ is the GPS to follow. ^{NRS} **Luke 9:23** Then he said to them all, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross <u>daily</u> and follow me. In this journey of Lent and journey of life, we need Jesus Christ to constantly be with us no matter where we go. ^{KJV} **PsaIm 23:4** Yea, though I walk <u>through</u> the valley of the shadow

of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me. As he leads and guides us through good and bad times, at the same time we grow in our relationship with him. We gain a deeper understanding of what it is like to live a lifestyle in Jesus Christ. To live that lifestyle constantly requires us to "recalculate" the road we are on. It also requires us to change even though it seems utterly wrong in our minds and others to do so. However, if Jesus Christ is our GPS for Lent and life, we know this: Jesus Christ will never lead us to where we will fail. The will of God will never take us where the grace of God will not support us. ^{NRS} 2 Corinthians 5:7 for we walk by faith, not by sight.



After praying for person after person in a particular village the last few days, hearing story after story, life after life; I've come to have a pretty complex masterpiece of this hanging in my mind.

From chronic all-body pains and ugly flesh wounds to broken marriages and stolen cows the Fulani know well the brokenness of this world.

We know from our own lives the brokenness all around us, bombarding us, perhaps even within us. The words, in Pular, as the subject of this email, are, "The Lord, the Shepherd." The Shepherd. One who cares for his sheep. One who looks after. One who helps. One who provides. One who guides. One who saves.

This is actually the 'theme title' of Pular calendars with scripture verses we are sharing this year to those who are in such desperate need of a loving Father and shepherd. An incredible message of saving hope to us, a needy people.

Charles "Chuck" W. Edler, Jr.

Charles "Chuck" W. Edler, Jr., 75, went home to be with the Lord on Monday, Feb. 7, 2011. Chuck was born July 5, 1935 in Owendale, to the late Charles and Frieda (Engelhard) Edler.

He joined the U.S. Army on March 1, 1954 and was honorably discharged on Feb. 13, 1957. In the Army he worked as a Radio Interceptor Operator for the Army Security Agency in Germany. MINUTES: The previous Council Minutes were reviewed by all present. A motion was made by Ray Licht to approve the minutes as presented, Lorraine LePage seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Loehrke reviewed his written report with everyone present and thanked everyone for the time off between Christmas and New Years. Pastor advised that he will be conducting a New Members Class starting in February and 1st Communion Classes will start in March. Highlights of his report were as follows:

TREASURER'S REPORT: Copies of the Treasurer's report were distributed to all present by Nancy Heck. Total income was reported at \$ 32,713.91 with a total income and beginning balance of \$ 64,716.45 and total expenses of \$ 33,110.54 with a balance on hand as of 12/31/2010 of \$31,605.91. Cross Evanglical Lutheran Building Fund showed a balance of \$ 3,129.27 on 12/31/2010. Ray Licht moved to accept the Treasurer's report and

seconded by Krisie Fritz. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY RE-

PORT: Paul Schuette reviewed his report for the period of 1/1/2010 through 12/31/2010, with everyone present. His report showed for 2010, Total Contributions for the General Fund were \$278,731.65; Budgeted amount was \$267,868.12; so the contributions at the end of the year were \$10,863.53 over budget. Other monies received throughout the year were as follows:
