## Message from Pastor Mike



#### 2018 NALC CON-VOCATION REPORT

They told us we were in Denver (actually Aurora, CO), but you would be hard pressed to prove it by me. Mostly what I saw was hotels, restaurants, office and apartment buildings. Only as I was leaving on Saturday did I see in the distance some hazy outline of mountains. The reason we couldn't see much of the mountains. I was told, was because of the California wildfires. (By the way, NALC Disaster Response is taking donations to help victims of those fires.)

I attended the continuing education theology lectures during the first 24 hours, then the convocation proper. The theme was the Holy Spirit. That was the focus of both the lectures and the speakers at the convocation. We also heard frequent references to the Spirit throughout the week.

NALC convocations don't do a whole lot of

actual business. think the benefit to me was more in the networking that is available. You meet lots of folks from all over the US and Can-You get to ada. speak with and ask questions one-on-one of all sorts of people. I met and sat at a table with the other Michigan pastors and their delegates. I got to know them through both the group discussions and the casual conversation. also saw lots of folks from previous congregations I've served.

This coming year will be a year of transition for the NALC. Bishop Bradoskv has nounced he will be retiring at the end of his term in 2019. So next year we will be electing a new bishop at our meeting in Indi-It will be anapolis. very important have a full complement of both pastors and lay delegates at this assembly. In addition, Dr. Amy Schifrin has announced that she will be step-



ping down as president of our seminary, so that she can concentrate on teaching before her contemplated retirement in 2022 or so. Our Board of Regents will be forming a search committee to find a new president who can focus on the primary duties of that office, administration and fundraising.

Speaking of funds, due to some major gifts, the seminary is in shape right now. The NALC as a whole, not quite as much. But in the past year benevolence increased 7.8%, our largest year to year increase ever. An increase this year of even half that much will bring our budget of \$2.1 million into balance. Still, it was disappointing to learn that 27% of our churches are sending in zero be-

nevolence, and many are far below the requested level of 5% of offerings (including Cross).

I learned the answer to two questions people have been asking me. One was, how many other NALC churches have parochial schools (not just preschools or afterschool programs)? The answer is two, one in Wisconsin, the other in Florida.

The other is about the likelihood of getting good candidates at Cross. Pastor David Wendel, assistant to the bishop, assured me there would probably be 3 or 4 good candidates right off the bat. Also, there is a fairly healthy crop of seminarians. Pastor Mark Chavez, the general secretary, says our ratio of seminarians to the number of congregations is better than most denominations, including the ELCA and the Missouri Synod. There were eleven ordinations in the NALC last year, pretty good for a denomination of 425 congregations.

And of course there were lots of other reports and speak-If you want to know ers. something, ask me! Traveling is a pain and tiring, but all in all, I think it's worth the trip. Of course, in 2019 in Indianapolis and 2020 in Pittsburgh, we'll be a lot closer.

Money was discussed that had been sent to a missionary from the first of the month Sunday School collections. Kathleen Lutz was suggested.


It was discussed that July 16, 2018 was the first day of VBS. We said Lori Smith & Re-

#### REFORMATION SUNDAY IS October 28th

The most enduring symbol of the Lutheran Reformation is the seal that Luther himself designed to represent his theology. By the early 1520s, this seal begins to appear on the title page of Luther's works.

Here is how Luther himself explained its meaning:


First, there is a black cross in a heart that remains its natural color. This is to remind me that it is faith in the Crucified One that saves us. Anyone who believes from the heart will be justified (Romans 10:10). It is a black cross, which mortifies and causes pain, but it leaves the heart its natural color.



It doesn't destroy nature, that is to say, it does not kill us but keeps us alive, for the just shall live by faith in the Crucified One (Romans 1:17). The heart should stand in the middle of a white rose. This is to show that faith gives joy, comfort, and peace—it puts the believer into a white, joyous rose. Faith does not give peace and joy like the world gives (John 14:27). This is why the rose must be white, not red. White is the color of the spirits and angels (Matthew 28:3; John 20:12). This rose should stand in a sky-blue field, symbolizing that a joyful spirit and faith is a beginning of heavenly future joy, which begins now, but is grasped in hope, not yet fully revealed. Around the field of blue is a golden ring to symbolize that blessedness in heaven lasts forever and has no end.
