From the Pastor's desk at Cross Lutheran Church-NALC,



*“Fear not, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom. Sell your possessions, and give to the needy. Provide yourselves with moneybags that do not grow old, with a treasure in the heavens that does not fail, where no thief approaches and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.” (Luke 12:32-34)*

Trophies, ribbons, and awards. Oh, my! Do you remember when you first learned of the importance of being “the best of the best?” You know, running faster, jumping higher, hitting farther than anyone else, and scoring the most points. And the proof of these accomplishments were coveted and cherished trophies, ribbons, and awards. These were things to display on a shelf, to hang on the wall, or wear on your chest. For me, I learned from others that these things were convincing proof that I was someone who had actually accomplished something.

I remember how proud I was to earn my first award. It was a green ribbon with gold lettering that proclaimed, “Fifth place: Shotput.” Looking back, I believe that there were only five contestants throwing the shot put at that track meet. The second award was a similar red ribbon that I received at a Junior High Intramural Basketball Tournament: 2<sup>nd</sup> place. I remember sitting on the bench most of those games, but I did experience an emotional high getting to “play” in the last 30 seconds of one game. My last year in Junior High I received a 1<sup>st</sup> place ribbon when competing in a wrestling tournament. The truth is that there were only two of us in the heavyweight division and my opponent forfeited the match by not showing up.

During high school I briefly played football, basketball, and baseball, but I only earned my numerals. Now I look back a little saddened that I graduated without the letter and the letter jacket, but if I had, I'm sure that the jacket would probably be a little snug now anyway. (Our sons and daughters all earned athletic letters and had letter jackets, so I'm happy with their successes!)

But my favorite sport was bowling! How proud I felt when I finally bowled on a winning team and earned my first bowling trophy! I loved bowling so much that I eventually bowled three nights a week and volunteered to be both the recording and financial secretary of the bowling league. My responsibilities were confirming weekly scores and totals and then posting them before the next week. And at the annual bowling banquet, I coordinated all of the arrangements including reserving the banquet hall, selecting the menu, and ordering and presenting the trophies and awards. I loved bowling!

Through those years, I earned many bowling trophies. Soon they were all

displayed on a large shelf in the living room. (Yes, my shotput and basketball ribbons were there, too!) It was quite the exhibit of personal accomplishments, but over time I found that if I wanted to keep them, I had to clean and dust them myself. Somehow the luster of my trophies and awards began to fade. They didn't seem as important as they once did.

When our youngest son turned 11 years old, we celebrated the day by having his birthday party at the local bowling alley. His friends were having a good time trying to knock down as many pins as possible with each throw and I must say that they were pretty good. LuAnne and I kept score (before automatic scoring) of how many doubles and "turkeys" were thrown as well as gutter balls and splits. After they had finished playing and sat down to eat "birthday pizza," I quickly went back home to make labels of each person's name as well as something that they had accomplished. The trophy shelf back home was now empty as I arrived back at the bowling alley with a boxful of awards. To their surprise, each young bowler received their own trophy with a freshly made label covering the former owner's name. That was about 25 years ago, but I still remember all their smiles as they proudly held their trophies high...the trophies that I once held higher than I should have...

And now...each time I hear a familiar hymn, I am reminded of all the trophies, ribbons, and awards that all of us cling to at times in our own lives. Trophies, ribbons and awards that only tarnish and collect dust. Yet with all that we have done and all that we have accomplished, all our "trophies" will one day be laid down, and their importance will soon be forgotten...

## From the Desk of...David Faupel

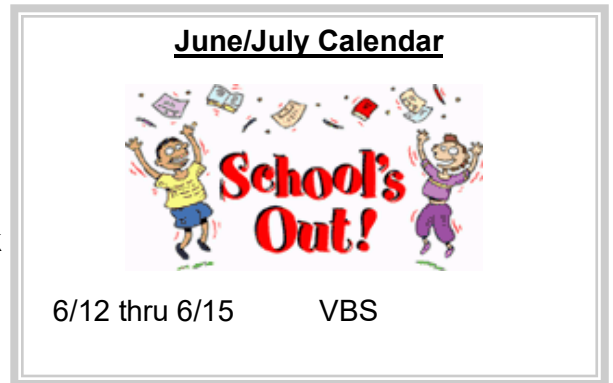

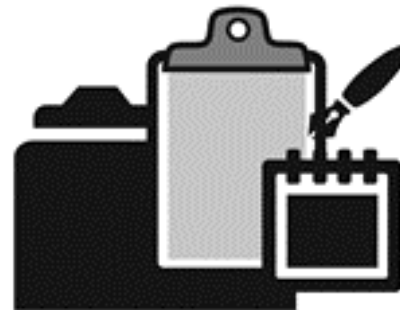


