and change echoed in our lives of faith. As children head back to school or our young people leave for college, the military, or other adventures, the Church continues her slow and steady growth — even as God begins to reap the harvest. Days grow shorter in the Northern Hemisphere, and nights grow longer, but God's abiding presence never falters.



Tuesday, August 13, 2024


The meeting was called to order by Pres. John Smith at 7 pm
