Ascension of Our Lord – May 29, 2025

"For this reason, because I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers..."

- Ephesians 1:15-16 -



Some Sundays as I stand in front of the congregation I serve in Northwest Ohio, I look at the familiar faces of those who worship with me and my heart swells with the joy of the Holy Spirit. I think to myself, "What a blessing it is to be among these people!" It's not that we are such extraordinary people with a greater capacity than others to love or serve. It's not that we have been given special gifts by the Spirit of God that are beyond compare to other congregations. It's simply that we have been brought together, many years ago, to be pastor and people and we have stuck it out through thick and thin. We know each other well - some days almost too well! But when we gather in the name of the Lord for worship, our hearts are joined as one in the unity of the Spirit, and it is something we feel deep within our souls.


St. Paul related similar sentiments to the elders in Ephesus as he wrote to them, encouraging them to be bold in their witness and steadfast in their service. He was not with them at the time, but word got back to him of their abiding faith and love towards all people in the larger community. We can only hope that others who live near our churches would hear about our love and good will and be moved to seek Jesus because of it. All too often it's our mistakes and foibles they hear about, rather than the genuine love and faith that we experience in life together in the faith community.

We are blessed to have each other. It's amazing how God draws so many different personalities and backgrounds of sinners to be one in Christ. We learn so much (sometimes it is a tough kind of learning) about what it means to accept each other, challenge each other, pray together, and serve side by side with a whole host of folks we probably wouldn't have hung out with if left to our own choosing. So, like St. Paul, we give thanks and remember in our prayers, all of our brothers and sisters who are devoted to Christ. And when we get those "spirit" nudges of joy and delight, we can say it out loud to each other, "What a blessing it is to be together with you as we worship Christ!"

The treasurer's report was given. A motion was made by Kim and seconded by Lori to approve the report. The motion was carried. Our last coffee hour donation was given to Kevin Ohlrogge to go to the groups Haitian Mission work.

The Mission Outreach group is trying to put together a welcome packet to give to people that are visiting our church. Lorraine will be bringing one that she received from a church she visited while in Chicago and this may give us ideas on what we want to put in our packets.

Easter cards were addressed and sent out to our shut-ins.

Our group will be in charge of coffee hour on April 27 with Lorraine, Krisie and Lori bringing food.

The NALC Spring Collection for Disaster relief was discussed. Krisie found out if things we collect are sent to Owosso, it will be used locally and not distributed nationwide unless there is a bigger need some place else. If the items collected are sent to Ohio, the items can be used anywhere in the USA where there is need, including Michigan, depending on who has the greatest need. A September disaster relief project is in the planning stage which will include church and school to donate and put together supplies for this. A date has not been set but will take place after school starts this next school year.

The garage sale was discussed. Lori will apply for Thrivent funding for this. Lorraine will be making flyers and save the date notices. An ad will be put in the View newspaper to let the surrounding communities know about the sale. Dates are set for June 6 - 14, with sale days on June 12, 13 and 14.

October 12th will be the kick-off date for Operation Christmas Child and ending on November 9th. The congregation and school children will be helping with the packing of the shoe boxes. Mission Outreach will do coffee hour on October 12 and November 9 to correlate with this project.
