### From the Desk of ... Beth Elston

In preschool we measure many aspects of children's development, across several domains. Obviously, student growth is measured in the cognitive domain, but this means much more than just learning numerals and alphabet letters. We assess whether a child is speaking in complete sentences, able to listen to and understand stories/books, and able to sustain attention during simple academic activities and the exploration of new materials and concepts. We measure student gains in the ability to manipulate and organize instructional materials, follow

directions, and formulate ideas about their work.

Alongside cognitive skills, student growth is also measured in regard to the social domain, which involves how students relate to each other and function as part of a group. Student emotional growth is also considered, as well as large motor (muscle) skills such as coordination, strength and balance. Growth is also measured in small motor skills, which enable students to manipulate pencils and crayons, and to color, trace and cut effectively. This may sound like a lot for students to practice and for teachers to keep track of. It is! But all this practice, and the planning and assessing that bring it to fruition, make the preschool classroom a very busy and happy place.

When was the last time you measured your growth? If you are an adult, it may have been awhile since you have thought about it, as we tend to associate the measurement of growth with children. But once our height and shoe size stabilize, and we finish our schooling and

enter adult life, do we really stop growing? Let's hope not! Even if you have been an adult for many, many years, you are still growing in many ways, across several domains. Chances are, you have learned a new piece of information (cognitive) quite recently. You have probably also been challenged or blessed in a relationship (social). You definitely have dealt with a frustration, sadness, concern or joy (emotional).

Think for a moment about how your recent experiences have brought about some growth in you. Think also about seeking a new growth opportunity for yourself. Is there someone or something that you can commit to helping or praying for? Is there a desire in you to change how or when you spend time communing with God? Is there an aspect of yourself that you want to bring to God for healing and renewal? God's mercies endure forever, so speak your heart to him.

Then thank God for helping you to grow.


